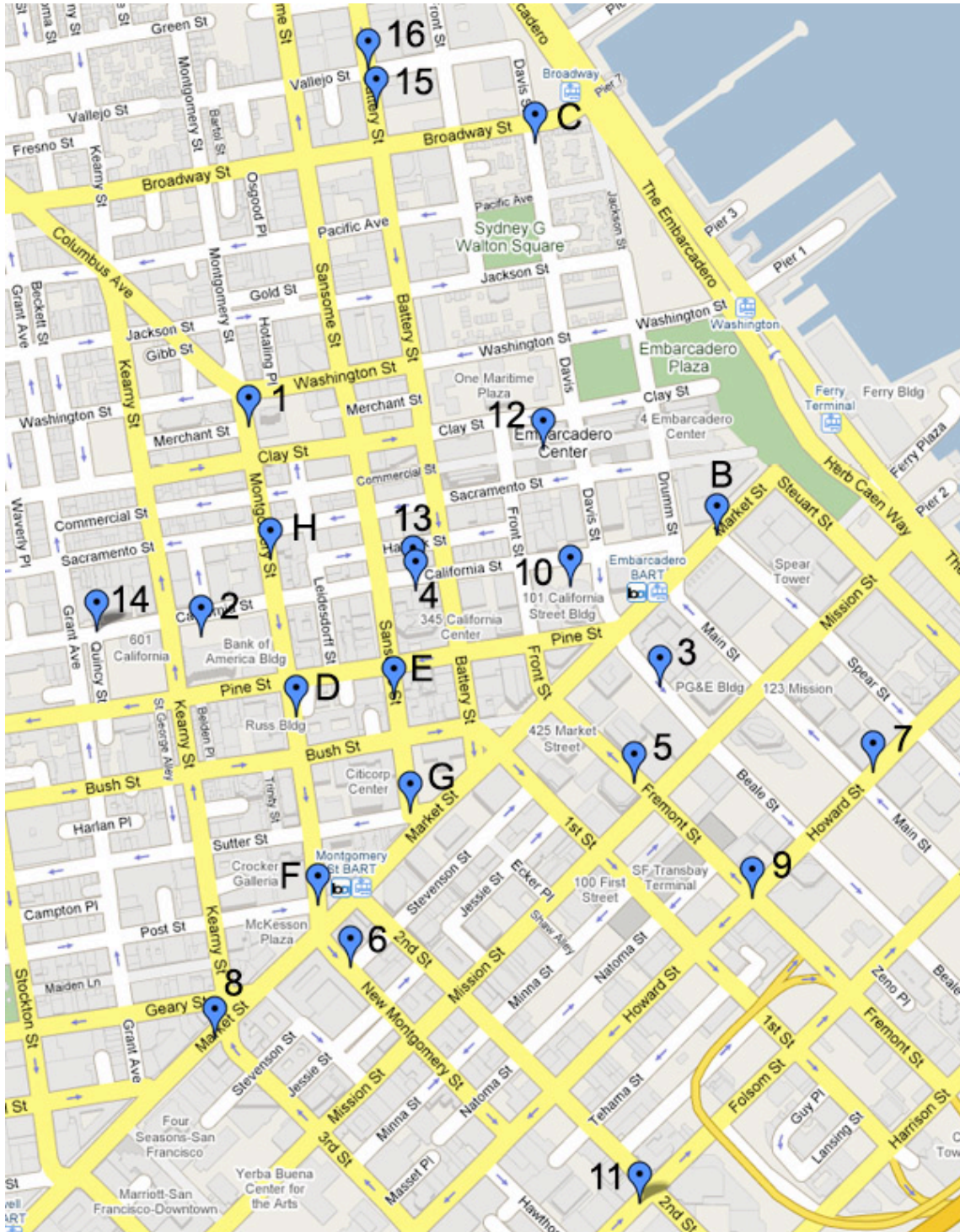

Direct. Action to Stop the War
San Francisco Day of Direct. Action
March 19, 2008



Several months ago, a group of Bay Area activists got together and re-started **Direct Action to Stop the War** (DASW). On March 20, 2003, DASW – a coordinating body/spokescouncil that brought together several thousand people from a broad cross-section of communities, social justice groups, and anti-war organizations – organized a massively successful shutdown of the San Francisco financial district, in protest of President Bush’s decision to invade and occupy Iraq.

Some of the people who were involved in that organizing effort, along with many new people, have re-started Direct Action to Stop the War, and are now planning a series of direct actions against corporate war profiteers and government offices in March 2008. We believe that the time has come for the anti-war movement to escalate our tactics, and put pressure directly on the people who are waging this war.

On March 19, 2008 – the fifth anniversary of the U.S. invasion of Iraq – Direct Action to Stop the War will be organizing a day of decentralized, multiple-target direct action against government offices and war profiteers in downtown San Francisco. We have created this menu of San Francisco offices of federal agencies, corporations with military contracts or contracts in Iraq, politicians who have failed to stop the war, and foreign embassies of countries linked to the war in Iraq. We are focusing primarily on corporations with military or Iraqi contracts, because we want to focus attention on the prominent role played by war-profiteering corporations in the U.S. occupation of Iraq. We will take direct action on March 19th against as many of these locations as possible, in order to send a clear message to the economic and political elites that control this country: No business as usual until all U.S. troops are withdrawn from Iraq!

We're asking that you get together with a group of your friends and allies, and plan a direct action against a government or corporate office on March 19th. In order for this action to be successful, it needs the energy, experience, and creativity that you and many others can bring.

If you decide to plan an action at a corporate or government office, we’d encourage you to come to the DASW general organizing meeting on March 2nd, at 674-A 23rd St. in Oakland, and announce what action you’re planning on doing. But if you don’t feel comfortable announcing your action at our meeting, please contact Adrian (adrianw@riseup.net) and tell him where and when your action will take place (so that he can let you know if someone else is planning on doing an action at that same location); anything you tell him will be strictly confidential.

Here's some suggestions of what kinds of actions you could do at a corporate or government office (and, of course, you could always do more than one):

- **Blockade the entrance to the building.** (If you feel up to it, we'd strongly encourage you to try to do a blockade/occupation of some sort, and we'd be glad to help you out with planning and logistics. Email the March 19th working group at dasw.march19th@gmail.com to learn more.)
- Occupy their office by handcuffing yourselves to desks or doorways.
- Do a sit-in or die-in in their office.
- Hang a banner from their building (again, we can help you out with that).
- Try to get into the company’s office and do as creative action (present a mock award, deliver a coffin, hold an impromptu “dance party for peace”...).

Or, you could do an action that isn’t specific to any single location - like altering billboards, or forming a roving bike brigade that pelts corporate offices with rotten vegetables, or anything else you can come up with! Basically, we would encourage you to be creative, come up with an anti-war action that excites you and your group, and then do it! And we're here to support you in any way we can. The Export-Import Bank – an arm of the U.S. government – has been heavily involved in Iraqi reconstruction contracts. Basically, it's like a little version of the World Bank, but with even less accountability & social responsibility.

The building has one revolving door and two single doors. It has two visible security guards.

Even after a large draw-down under Prime Minister Brown, Britain still has about 4500 troops in Iraq.

Citigroup is apparently the largest funder of KBR, the Halliburton subsidiary that is by far the largest recipient of Iraq contracts. (More research needs to be done to confirm this.)

This building has two revolving doors and two double doors on the Sutter St. side, and three double doors inside a plaza on the Sansome St. side. It has a lot of security.

Together with the Washington Group - which it bought in May 2007 - URS had \$10.2 billion in total military revenues 2003-2006 (16th biggest U.S. military contractor), and \$4.13 billion in Iraq contracts 2003-2006 (making it the second largest holder of Iraqi contracts, after Kellogg Brown & Root).

The Carlyle Group has been the leading private equity investor in military industries for more than a decade; it has completed 23 military-related transactions, with a total value of \$7.4 billion. It controls the following military contractors: ARINC U.S. (36th biggest U.S. military contractor), Sequa, Vought, Combined Systems, and Wesco Aircraft: (total value of military contracts from these companies: at least \$4 billion/year). It is currently negotiating to buy Booz Allen Hamilton's government consulting business. It is also a major shareholder of United Defense Industries.

The Transamerica Building has six large doors and two parking garage entrances. It has two security desks, with at least ten guards.

The Carlyle Group has been the leading private equity investor in military industries for more than a decade; it has completed 23 military-related transactions, with a total value of \$7.4 billion. It controls the following military contractors: ARINC U.S. (36th biggest U.S. military contractor), Sequa, Vought, Combined Systems, and Wesco Aircraft: (total value of military contracts from these companies: at least \$4 billion/year). It is currently negotiating to buy Booz Allen Hamilton's government consulting business. It is also a major shareholder of United Defense Industries. Carlyle's office is on the 34th floor.

Goldman Sachs is a major underwriter for Kellogg Brown & Root, the former Halliburton subsidiary that is the biggest Iraq contractor. Goldman Sachs contributed \$390,600 to Bush's campaign in 2004 (5th biggest contributor).

Morgan Stanley is a major underwriter for URS, the 16th biggest U.S. military contractor and 2nd biggest Iraq contractor (see above). Morgan Stanley contributed \$600,480 to Bush's campaign in 2004 (biggest contributor).

This skyscraper has two sets of three revolving doors upstairs, three double doors downstairs, and two garage entrances. It has 4-5 visible security guards.

Bechtel Corp.

Bechtel had \$5.40 billion in total military revenues 2003-2006 (26th biggest U.S. military contractor), and \$2.3 billion in Iraq contracts 2003-2007. (Bechtel withdrew its Iraq operations in 2007.)

Through the International Tax & Investment Center, Chevron has lobbied for the passage of the Iraqi Oil Law and the privatization of Iraq's oil resources. Chevron execs also met with the Iraqi National Congress in 2002 to divide up Iraq's oil reserves.

This skyscraper has two large doors in the front, and a garage entrance in the back (on Pine St.). One security guard.

This location is in a skyscraper, with numerous entrances and lots of security.

AT&T had at least \$1.12 billion in U.S. military revenues 2004-2007. Also, in 2006, whistleblower Mark Klein alleged that in Room 641A of AT&T's 611 Folsom facility, the National Security Agency operated an intercept facility, which it used to monitor all internet traffic passing through the building.

The facility is a Sprint store inside 2 Embarcadero Center, on the ground level. The entrance to the facility is a single double door.

The building has two double doors, and one security guard.

Credit Suisse is a major underwriter for Kellogg Brown & Root, the former Halliburton subsidiary that is the biggest Iraq contractor. Credit Suisse contributed \$331,040 to Bush's campaign in 2004 (7th biggest contributor).

NBC's parent corporation, General Electric, had \$14.6 billion in total military revenues 2003-2006 (10th biggest U.S. military contractor), and \$8.5 million in Iraq contracts 2003-2006.

The entrance to the building is a single double door, locked (keycard), with no security desk. The outside door is used only by NBC.

Fox News

Fox News blatantly advocated for Iraq War, and essentially served as a propaganda mouthpiece for the Bush Administration.

The entrance to the building is a single unlocked double door, with no security desk. Multiple offices use this entrance.
