Dr Andreas von Bülow

Von Bülow received his doctoral degree in law in Heidelberg in 1969, and was a Member of the German Parliament (Deutscher Bundestag) 1969-1994, where he served on "der Parlamentarischen Kontrollkommission" (PKK), the parliamentary commission which oversees the three branches of the German intelligence/security services. He also served as a State Secretary of the Minister for Defense 1976-1980 and as a German Cabinet Minister for Research and Technology 1980-1982 (under Chancellor Helmut Schmidt). In early 1990s, he served on the parliamentary inquiry investigating organized crime and intelligence activities of the former East Germany. Later, he has been working as a lawyer. He has written books on intelligence services and the 911 events (a.buelow@online.de).

Prof John B. Cobb, Jr.

Cobb joined the US Army in 1943. After his PhD in 1952, he taught at the Candler School of Theology of Emory University, Atlanta, Georgia. In 1958, he moved to the Claremont School of Theology, California. In 1971, with Lewis Ford, he started the journal of *Process Studies*, and in 1973, together with David Ray Griffin, he founded the Center for Process Studies, where the two of them were co-directors. Cobb has held many positions, including Ingraham Professor of Theology at the Claremont School of Theology, Avery Professor at the Claremont Graduate School, Fullbright Professor at the University of Mainz, Visiting Professor at Vanderbilt, Harvard, and Chicago Divinity Schools. He is now Professor Emeritus at Claremont School of Theology. His has written numerous books (cobbj@cgu.edu).

Prof Richard Falk

Falk is Alfred G. Milbank Professor of International Law Emeritus at Princeton University and Visiting Distinguished Professor in Global and International Studies at the University of California, Santa Barbara. In 2001 he served on a three person Human Rights Inquiry Commission for the Palestine Territories that was appointed by the United Nations, and previously, on the Independent International Commission on Kosovo. He is the author or coauthor of numerous books.
