DR. SEIN WIN

PRIME MINISTER IN EXILE, NCGUB

Dr. Sein Win is the Prime Minister of the National Coalition Government of the Union of Burma (NCGUB). The main goal of NCGUB is to restore democracy and human rights in Burma. Dr. Sein Win became involved in politics after the brutal military crackdown on pro-democracy activists during the 1988 uprising. He is currently serving his fifth term.

TOE LWIN

NATIONAL LEAGUE FOR DEMOCRACY (NLD)

Toe Lwin is a former political prisoner. Since 1988, he has been involved in the National League for Democracy (NLD). In 2003, he was arrested in an attempt to protect Daw Aung San Suu Kyi from a violent mob organized by the regime. He was severely tortured until his release in 2003. Toe Lwin left for the Thai-Burma border in July 2007 and continues to work on political campaigns for democracy in Burma.

Chivy Sok, an educator, trainer, consultant and researcher on human rights and child labor.
