

Since the election of Former General Otto Pérez Molina to the presidency in Guatemala, the country has seen disturbing trends toward re-militarization and repression of social movements, with recent moves to criminalize indigenous activists defending their right to their ancestral lands.

Iduvina Hernández, a Guatemalan journalist and human rights defender, will discuss the impact in Guatemala of having many of the officials mentioned in the documentary, who have been implicated in crimes against humanity, still in positions of power.
