## The speakers are:

- Dr. Amer S. Araim, Imam of the Dar-UI- Islam Mosque in Walnut Creek; Member of Boards of Interfaith Council of Contra Costa County, and former UN Secretary of the Special Committee against Aparthied and on Decolonization.
- Rabbi Lynn Gottlieb, an Advisory Board member from the Jewish Voice for Peace, will speak on the JVP's position as to how to achieve peace between Israel and Palestine. She is the Coordinator of FOR Interfaith Peace walks, and co-founder of Shomer Shalom Network for Jewish Non-Violence.
- Rabbi Moshe Levin of the Congregation Ner Tamid in San Francisco will present a second Jewish view as to how to achieve peace in the region. He recently returned from a six weeks visit to the Middle East where he met with leaders from Israel and Palestine.
- Rev. Dr. Stephen Furrer, Interim Minister of the First Unitarian Universalist Church of San Francisco, will be the moderator for this Panel Discussion.
