Workers Demand Fair Share As Contract Talks Open

SBC workers took to the streets as bargaining talks opened on February 12th. The themes that echoed throughout the day were spelled out by Greg Ball, President of Local 9421.

"We've gathered here together to Take a Stand for Jobs and HealthCare! This is not just CWA's fight. This is a fight of every Labor Union, as evident by the ongoing struggle of our Brothers and Sisters in the UFCW since last October."

"We're here to send a message. A loud and clear message to SBC and any other employer out there who thinks cost shifting of premiums (to workers) is a good idea to increse their bottom line.

Let me tell you what our bottom line is...Messing with our Health Care is a Sick Idea...And anyone who tries to do it will pay the price!!!"

CWA MEMBER RELIEF FUND How you can "Afford" to strike!

The major concern of our membership is how they can take care of themselves and their families if a strike becomes necessary. This information should alleviate the fear of having no income should we strike.

CWA has a Member Relief Fund with more than \$200 million dollars with contributions continuing by 700,000 members if we are on strike. Strikers who pull their strike assignment, whether it be walking the picket line, serving on a committee or other assignment by the Local will be entitled to \$200.00 per week beginning the 15th day of the strike and \$300.00 per week beginning the 29th day of a strike.

Each striker is entitled to an additional strike fund check 7 days after the conclusion of the strike. (The rationale of \$200 beginning the $15^{\rm th}$ day of the strike is we will get a paycheck sometime within that 15 day period).

In addition, you may be able to defer mortgage, car and credit card payments. The Local can assist you in calling your creditors and the Local will help find temporary employment through Temp Agencies.

While this may not equal the income you are currently receiving, if you are able to defer some or all of your payments, or pay the interest only, you receive strike payments and you get a temporary job, you can survive during a strike, if one should become necessary.

SBC Team Award will be paid out this month. Put it in the bank in case we are forced to strike, if not, you will have it when the contract is settled. SBC is a profitable company, thanks to our hard work.

Getting a fair contract, one that we deserve, is going to depend on YOU and how well prepared YOU are. We must all send one message to the Company and that is:

"We are not afraid and we will strike if provoked!"

No man (or woman) has a right to scab so long as there is a pool of water to drown his carcass in, or a rope long enough to hang his body with. Judas was a gentleman compared to a scab. For betraying his master, he had character enough to hang himself. A scab has not.

Grocery Workers Return To Work

UFCW members in Southern California voted 86 percent to ratify a new agreement affecting 70,000 grocery workers at almost 900 stores, with three supermarket companies, Safeway, Kroger and Albertsons, on February 26, 2004.

After 20 weeks without paychecks, workers won their fight to protect affordable health care, their pensions and job security. The companies demanded separate health and pension plans for current and future employees which would have resulted in the effective elimination of health care and retirement security benefits for workers.

The support and solidarity of millions of people and organizations across the country was essential to the workers. From the first day on, customers refused to cross the lines with an average of 75% of customers shopping elsewhere, amounting to estimated loses of more than \$2 billion for the companies. Workers spirits were also lifted by community support including rallies and hundreds of thousands of dollars in food and financial aid. Many national and local political, faith and labor leaders put their bodies on the line to defend the grocery workers...


