The American red fraction, deriving its political genealogy from Marx, Engles, Lenin, Stalin and Mao in direct succession to Comrade Chiang Ching and finally Chairman Gonzalo, assert that it is the interest of American communists to support the development of a new International to place to place Maoism in the position of being the sole command and guide of world revolution; to pursue the struggle to beat back right deviationist attempts to reverse correct verdicts to its completion and found militarized communist parties in every country, especially the United States. Criticism of their revisionist line and its pernicious influence are of cardinal importance to the future and the destiny of a militarized proletarian party in the United States. The right deviation's recent "hundred flowers movement" is a sham! The power they hold is used to recruit deserters and renegades, form cliques to serve their own selfish interests, rig up a bourgeois headquarters, formulate a revisionist-eclectic line, and push it from the top to the bottom. They consolidate and extend bourgeois right, protect their own interests, namely the interests of "high officials" who practice revisionism, embezzle and squander donated funds. Hiding under the cloak of Marxism-Leninism-Maoism and waving all sorts of ensigns, they are able to mislead for a time a number of people who lack understanding of the real situation and a high level of consciousness, deceiving them into following their revisionist-eclectic line.

After the death of Mao Tse-tung the right deviation would express itself under the slogans "government of the whole people" as opposed to the revolutionary "dictatorship of the proletariat" and gave priority to production as opposed to the revolutionary road "taking class struggle as the key link", and would entrench itself in the Teng Hsiao-ping "three worlds theory" which, in America, would ultimately find its expression as "socialist" racism, sexism and homophobia; the hierarchy of the oppressed, the diversion of revolutionary activity to little bourgeois struggles, the redefinition of the proletariat in terms which have nothing to do with labor or actual class standing, the over emphasis on so-called "objective" conditions to divert the struggle away from the leadership problems and the axiomatic deployment of the so-called "general crisis theory" [Althusser]--which denies the leading role of the party and putting politics in command. It turned revolutionaries into cheerleaders for third world struggles.

The new International must affirm our capability of founding a militarized communist party and the development of revolutionary people's war in the United States and in fact must do so. The assertion that the third world is the seat of revolution today followed by the denunciation of imperialist encirclement and interference in revolutionary upheavals followed by lamentations over counter-revolution in the USSR and China only underscore the necessity of developing revolutionary war in the United States. We applaud the MPP's leadership in this cause.

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
