

The record speaks for itself: The “Most Peace-Loving of Nations” has been engaged in brutal military campaigns in every corner of the globe, unceasingly, since its inception. A member of the leadership council of Colorado AIM (American Indian Movement), he is a past national spokesperson for the Leonard Peltier Defense Committee. A prolific writer and lecturer, he has authored, co-authored or edited more than 20 books.
