Wednesday, November 21st:

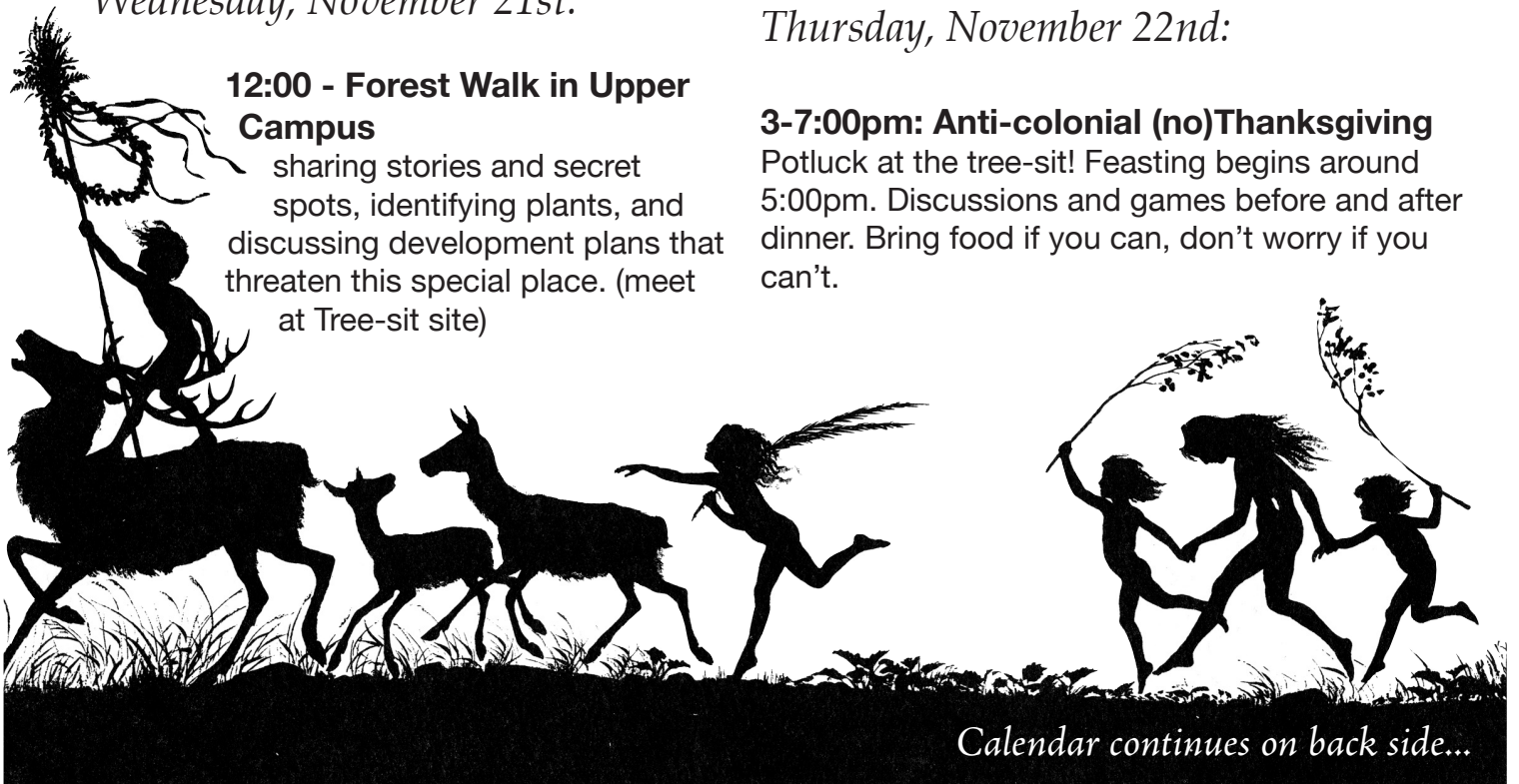
12:00 - Forest Walk in Upper Campus
