

What is the Prisoner Subscription Fund (PSF)?

The PSF is a fund used to send the Bay View to indigent prisoners throughout the country, and we need your help to get it to them. Currently, there are several hundred prisoners on the PSF waitlist. Monthly subscriptions cost \$3.25 and a one-year subscription costs \$39.

Some history...

The San Francisco Bay View (originally called *The New Bayview*) began in 1976 under the direction of Mohammed al-Kareem. In 1992, Willie and Mary Ratcliff began publishing the paper, and have been at it ever since. Over the years, the Bay View has won numerous awards, including National Black Newspaper of the Year, the Media Alliance Best Community Newspaper of the Year, and the James Madison Freedom of Information Award, among others.
