# No Bannings, No Police, No Union Busting at Community Radio!



Nadra Foster, a volunteer radio programmer for over a decade and graduate of KPFA's Apprenticeship Program, was violently arrested and removed from the station by the Berkeley Police Department in August 2008 at the order of KPFA Management. The original reason cited leading to a "banning" from the progressive radio station dedicated to 'peace'? For printing paper and using the phone.

Foster, a young African-American mother of two children, suffered injuries and is facing misdemeanor charges in Alameda County Court. Nadra has secured a lawyer, but needs <u>assistance</u> to cover legal costs, and pay medical bills.

KPFA management, backed by <u>"Concerned Listeners"</u> majority running your Local Station Board, have stated **their 'regret'**, yet have **blocked efforts for an investigation**, and refused responsibility for the actions of the police.

The Unpaid Staff Organization (UPSO) is the main sponsor of this event.
