

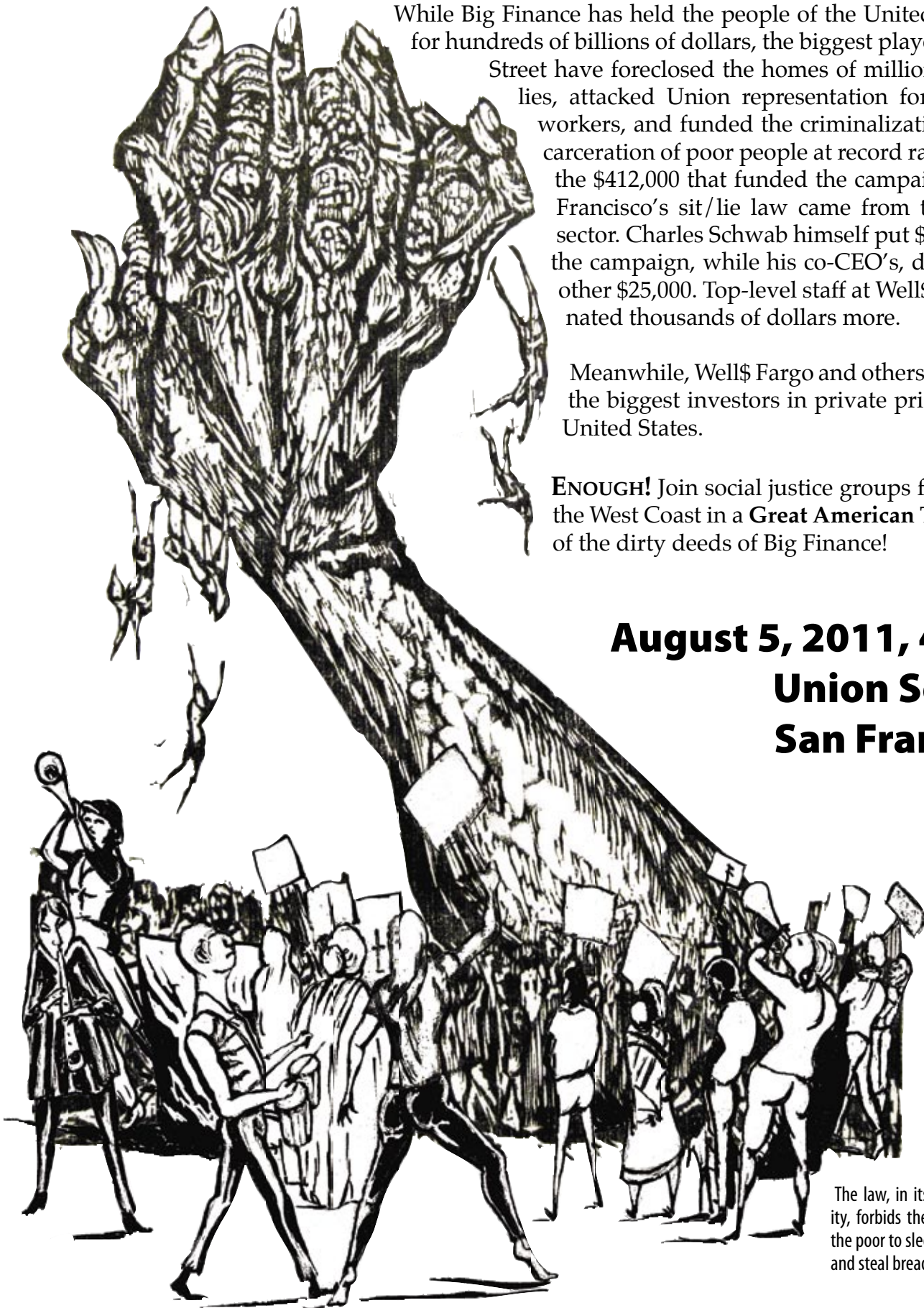
Great American TARP Tour

While Big Finance has held the people of the United States up for hundreds of billions of dollars, the biggest players on Wall Street have foreclosed the homes of millions of families, attacked Union representation for front-line workers, and funded the criminalization and incarceration of poor people at record rates. 72% of the \$412,000 that funded the campaign for San Francisco's sit/lie law came from the finance sector. Charles Schwab himself put \$30,000 into the campaign, while his co-CEO's, donated another \$25,000. Top-level staff at Well\$ Fargo donated thousands of dollars more.

Meanwhile, Well\$ Fargo and others are among the biggest investors in private prisons in the United States.
