Three years of resistance to the coup

Three years ago on June 28, the democratically-elected president of Honduras, Manuel Zelaya, was overthrown in a military coup supported by the U.S. government. At that time, the people of Honduras were mobilized in a campaign for a new constitution and for economic and social justice.

Since the coup and illegitimate election of Porfirio Lobo, the people of Honduras are experiencing severe and growing repression, including the assassination of 4 civilians by the U.S. Drug and Enforcement Agency in a shocking military attack on May 11, 2012.

Here are some of the facts:

- More than 50 campesinos have been murdered in the Aguán region alone since the 2010 elections.
- More than 23 journalists and at least 70 LGBT activists murdered since the coup, including Erick Martinez Avila, LGBT leader and LIBRE Party candidate, was murdered.
- Political murders of resistance activists continue.
- As U.S. involvement grows, this can only mean more repression and abuse of human rights of the Honduran people.
