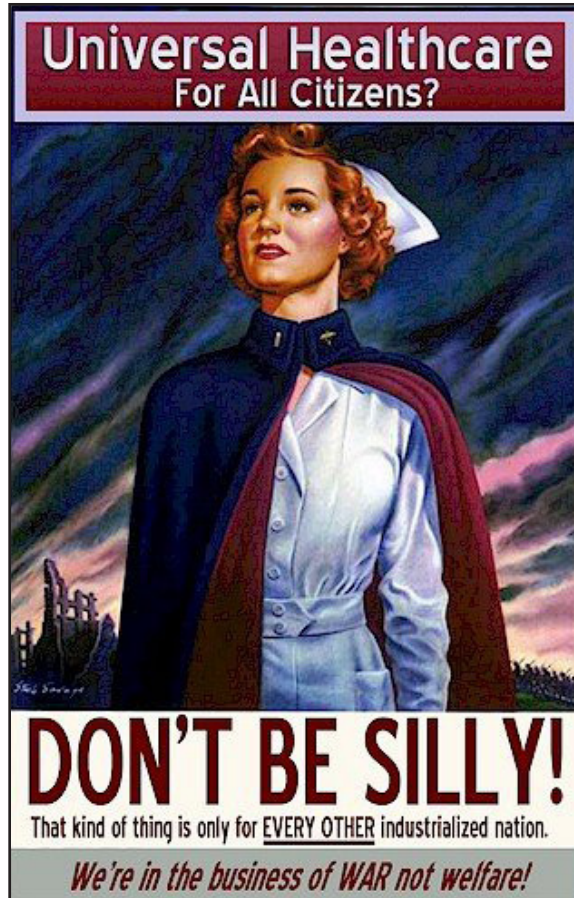


THE HEALTH CARE MOVIE
