



Street performers with guitar case on the sidewalk to collect tips do not need a permit but must not perform in prohibited locations listed in this brochure.

A group of three or more street performers with a display will exceed the 12 s.f. space. They qualify for a Street Performing Permit.

When performing, as a courtesy, please

- Do not block pedestrian traffic
- Monitor and manage crowd size
- Reduce the volume of music if asked
- Clean up any mess after performing



Areas Exempt from 14-foot distance
Three areas are exempt from the 14 feet distance limit but all other rules apply.

- 1) Tom Scribner statue. See drawing above.
- 2) Garden planter at Pacific Avenue/Locust Street intersection. These two areas are delineated by brass markers in the sidewalk.
- 3) SE corner of the Cooper St. / Pacific Ave. intersection.

Santa Cruz welcomes Street Performers

You may perform on any public sidewalks in the Downtown without a permit as long as you do not block pedestrian traffic.

However, if you place an object on the sidewalk (display device) to either collect tips or use as a prop for your performance, you must abide by the time, place and manner regulations.
