Join No Nukes Action as we screen the film *Fukushima: Living With Disaster* (18 min. by Greenpeace). This excellently produced film looks at the present situation in Fukushima five years after the meltdowns and explosions that spewed radioactive material in Japan and throughout the world. There are tens of thousands of bags of radioactive waste with no place to go, and the children and families are being told that they must return to Fukushima because it has been “decontaminated”, and the Japanese Abe government is saying the radiation can be “overcome”. They also lied to the Olympic committee that the problem was solved in Fukushima despite the continued release of contaminated water

into the Pacifica ocean.

This meeting will also hear a report on the struggle in Okinawa against US military bases which will contain nuclear weapons. The US and Japanese government are seeking to remilitarize Japan and this increases the danger of war in Asia.

No Nukes Action organizes against nuclear power in Japan and around the world. It has a monthly speak out and rally every 11th of the month at the Japanese consulate at 3 PM at 275 Battery St. near California St. in San Francisco.
