Three perspectives on REAL action to combat the climate crisis

In 2015 the world came together in Paris, and progress has been made since. But with the US withdrawal from that summit's agreement, what can WE do, in our daily lives, to help stop global warming?

Governor Brown is hosting a "Global Climate Action Summit" in San Francisco from September 14 to 16, but he has been criticized for not doing enough. Will this gathering propose serious, workable solutions to the current climate disaster?

Our August forum will feature three climate change activists: **KATHY SETIAN**, Environmental Engineer and retired EPA Superfund Project Manager; **PENNIE OPAL PLANT**, a co-founder of Idle No More SF Bay and signatory to the Indigenous Women of the Americas Defending Mother Earth Treaty; and **JAN KIRSCH**, medical doctor, speaker on environmental issues for Physicians for Social Responsibility, and coordinator of the 350 Bay Area Speakers' Bureau.
