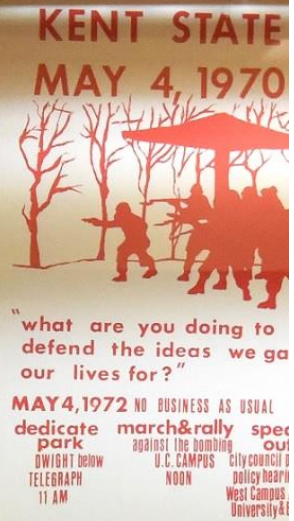

On May 4, 1970, four students were killed on the campus of Kent State University in Kent, Ohio, when Ohio National Guardsmen opened fire on a line of protesters. These children were injured by M1 rifle ammunition.

On the second anniversary of the day of the Vietnam Veterans' march, members of Berkeley, who carried protest signs to the site, dedicated a public park to the Kent State martyrs.
