

This film, which won the Oscar for Best Documentary in 2024, shows the daily reality of apartheid and ethnic cleansing for residents of Masafer Yatta (a region in the southern West Bank) and the need for a joint future of shared safety. The film portrays stories of Palestinian daily life and the experience of Israeli Jews who reject the status quo that are often erased in U.S. conversations about Israel/Palestine, Israeli filmmaker Yuval Abraham said in his <u>Academy Award acceptance</u> speech,
