Natasha Dedrick: An Alabama journey into history, healing, and interconnectedness

As spiritually rooted people, how do we engage with a history we didn't (and wouldn't) choose, systems and beliefs we inherited, and bodies we were born into? After a recent journey to Alabama with Glide Memorial Church, Natasha came back inspired to share potent experiences from the trip and engage in deep collective reflection. The presentation is offered primarily as an invitation to white-bodied people to look honestly at what we've inherited and to consider what we can do with it. Everyone is welcome.

For more than three decades, Natasha's activism and community organizing have focused on poverty, racism, mass incarceration, war, and unjust working conditions, including two years helping communities recover after Hurricane Katrina.
